And finally, after a thorough development period, we are delighted to announce the new Victorian – Local Jobs First – Management Centre (VMC) will be operational for all new tenders from July 1. With an intuitive and user friendly interface, we anticipate its release to be a game changer for both Agencies and Bidders.

Whilst the process goes online, we still have real people, our Industry Advisers on hand to provide assistance to all Bidders that request it and our Client Services Team that bring their exemplary customer service skills to the job each day. They are here to help navigate through this transition period. I'm proud to say that our people are our point of difference, and the lifeblood of ICN.

Joan Kirner Women's and Children's Hospital Lendlease and ICN Victoria a cooperative relationship

Planning for both present and future demand on health care in the west led to the development of the Joan Kirner Women's and Children's Hospital in Sunshine.

The Joan Kirner Women's and Children's Hospital (JKWCH) is a purpose built, iconic hospital designed to provide safe, highquality services for women and children in a contemporary setting that promotes both healing and wellbeing. Built to meet the needs of one of the fastest growing areas in Australia, the JKWCH is providing access to children's services and ensuring more women in Melbourne's west are able to give birth and access children's services closer to home.

The new multi-storey facility consists of 20 labour delivery rooms, 39 Special Care Nursery cots, 64 women's inpatient beds, 32 children's inpatient beds, four operating theatres and additional outpatient clinics. As part of the project, 55 existing acute adult inpatient beds at Sunshine Hospital will also be refurbished.

Lendlease, the managing contractor for the project, engaged ICN Victoria on localisation activities and the Victorian Industry Participation Policy (VIPP)* implementation.

The \$200M project came under VIPP and required consideration of competitive local suppliers in the awarding of contracts to maximise local content.


The cooperative relationship between Lendlease and ICN Victoria began with the initial VIPP assistance provided during the tender phase and developed over the various phases of the project.


Collaborative activities undertaken include:

- Lendlease engaging ICN at the tender phase to increase local content
- Lendlease utilising the Government listed ICN Gateway Joan Kirner Women's and Children's Hospital Project page for securing suppliers
- Lendlease utilising supplier identification from ICN database, as well as ICN research including direct phone calls and site visits
- Lendlease engaging with ICN on supplier shortfalls to engage local supply chain and ensure local content is maximised.

The OrcaDrain range includes optimum Australian made and tested polymer concrete drainage products, delivering high-quality products to the civil construction market in Australia and New Zealand. Committed to providing quality environmental drainage products for Victoria's burgeoning construction industry, Ken Williams, Director said "We are proud to supply quality Australian products and to be part of the industry building Victoria's infrastructure. We all take special pride in seeing our products utilised in these large projects which positively improve the welfare of the community. Particular thanks

are due to Local Jobs First and the Commissioner. With their support, we have been able to raise the profile of our business and bring our products and manufacturing capacity to the attention of the key decision makers in infrastructure projects."

A successful businessman, Ken Williams and fellow Director Alan Travers, spent two years relocating their high tech, polymer concrete plant from China to Australia. While it did not come without its challenges, Ken Williams had this piece of advice for other similar businesses wanting to take the leap "Don't underestimate the efficiency savings and improved customer relationships and service that can be achieved by bringing production onshore. Manufacturing in Australia benefits from reduced lead times, customization possibilities, legal regulatory, transparency and freedom from currency exposure. There is also cashflow benefits arising from improved inventory turnover and locally available trading terms. Most importantly you are in control of your own destiny, without the risk of opening an incoming shipping container

and seeing from the substandard contents that you are about to disappoint a hard-won client."



Director Alan Travers re-iterated similar words, showing his support of the Local Jobs First Policy, "Since our relocation and re-commissioning we have enjoyed a refreshingly different legislative environment. The Victorian Government has been approachable and

proactive in their assistance and have been instrumental in guiding us through roadblocks to having our products considered for infrastructure projects. Their assistance has allowed our business to develop considerably and correspondingly increase our local employment numbers."

Whilst Orca Civil's Polymer Plant was located in China's Jiangsu province, a well-developed area and in close proximity to two major Shanghai ports, a lack of transparency in foreign owned business requirements, made it difficult to continue manufacturing there.





The decision to relocate to Australia was a difficult one and one that did not come easy. Director Alan Tavers said, "The costs in moving such a large sized plant were considerable and the disruption to our business difficult to overestimate."

However, in 2014, Orca Civil decommissioned their plant, containerised their equipment in dozens of shipping containers and relocated to Victoria. A move that has since seen Orca Civil not only grow and increase sales, but more importantly – increase local employment rates and provide locally manufactured products not only to Victoria, but Australia-wide. Commissioner, Don Matthews, visited Orca Civil showing his support for local businesses once again. A proud advocate of Local Jobs First and Victorian workers, Don Matthews said "This is what the Local Jobs First Policy is about, to support and give Victorian businesses a fair go. Thanks to the Local Jobs First Policy, we are seeing many more local businesses like Orca Civil providing quality products and services to large state-wide government projects."
